PETITION.

That all Cases on Appeal in the Supreme Court of British Columbia be printed according

to specifications similar to that required by law in the Supreme Court of Canada. That in no case whatever shall type-written work be accepted in lieu of the regular letter-

press printing by the Supreme Court of British Columbia for the aforesaid Cases on Appeal. That they be required to be printed in British Columbia for the Supreme Court of British Columbia, and in no case be allowed to be printed outside of the Province.

That aforesaid work shall be printed in offices by people doing business as letterpress

printers.

Wherefore your petitioners humbly pray that your Honourable House may be pleased to grant your petitioners' request.
