That your petitioners are desirous of being incorporated as a company, with power to construct, equip, and operate a telephone and telephone lines in that portion of the Province of British Columbia lying north of the 51st parallel of latitude, except as to those portions of Lillooet, Kamloops, Revelstoke, and Columbia Electoral Districts lying north of the said parallel; together with all other usual, necessary, or incidental rights, powers, or privileges as may be necessary or conducive to the above objects or any of them.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray that your Honourable Body may be pleased to pass an Act granting to your petitioners the above powers.
