Whereas it is in the interest of the public that a system of electric lighting should be constructed, operated, and maintained in and about the present Town of Nelson and its vicinity:

And whereas your petitioners are desirous of being incorporated by an Act of the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia as a joint stock company under the name of the "Nelson Electric Light Company, Limited," for the purpose of constructing, operating, and maintaining a system of electric lighting in and about the said town and its vicinity, and of being authorized to take so much of the waters of Cottonwood-Smith Creek as may be necessary for generating electricity for the supply of the said system, with power, also, to your petitioners to erect, lay, and string such poles, pipes, and wires through, along, over, and under the streets and highways of the said town and its vicinity, as may be necessary :

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable Body may be pleased to pass an Act for the purposes above mentioned.
