To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled :

The petition of the undersigned, Charles George Major, of the City of New Westminster, in the Province of British Columbia, Financial Agent, Johann Wulffsohn, of the City of Vancouver, Banker, and Arthur Williams Jones, of the City of Victoria, Financial Agent, humbly sheweth :—

That your petitioners are desirous of being incorporated under the corporate name of “The Nakusp and Slocan Railway Company,” for the purpose of constructing, equipping, maintaining and operating a line of railway from some point at or near the Town of Nakusp to some point at or near the Forks of Carpenter Creek, in the District of West Kootenay, in the Province of British Columbia, with power to construct and operate telegraph and telephone lines in connection with the said railway, together with the usual powers to acquire lands, privileges, bonuses or aids from the Dominion or Provincial Governments, and to make traffic and other arrangements with steamboat and other companies, and for all other usual and necessary powers, rights and privileges.
