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- Deputy Speaker stated that in keeping with parliamentary practice and traditions, Minister's apology ends the matter, 84, 85, 88.
- Material tendered does not constitute new information in this case that would change the findings of last July 15, 1996 on the same issue, 10, 20-21.
- Material tendered does not indicate an intention to deliberately mislead, 10, 19-20.

Matter amounts to a disagreement between Members; dispute as to facts, 70, 72-73.

Matter amounts to an appeal of Deputy Speaker's decision which is clearly contrary to Standing Orders 9 and 15; contains charge of bias against Deputy Speaker which can only be brought forward by distinct motion on notice, 95, 96, 97-98.

Power of referral of a Bill to Committee is permissive only, and discretion for such referral was intended to remain prerogative of Minister in charge of the Bill, 121, 122, 129-130.

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- When all events leading up to a statute revision coming into effect have taken place, the appropriate method of bill drafting would be to refer to the revision rather than to the previous reference, 27, 27-28.
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- Not competent for Member to move adjournment of House as part of an application under Standing Order 35, 63, 64.
