No. 4. PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia:

The petition of John Hopp, of Barkerville, British Columbia, Free Miner, respectfully sheweth:—

- 1. That your petitioner is the owner of the real estate, placer mining claims, mining leases and placer mining record claims set out in Schedule "A" hereto, and of the Water Rights set out in Schedule "B" hereto.
- 2. That your petitioner has been actively engaged in working the said mining property for several years last past, but that it is necessary, in order to successfully operate the same, to obtain a large amount of capital to instal further mining equipment and to properly open up and operate the said mining property, and it is further necessary for such successful operation that the water rights mentioned in Schedule "B," which are appurtenant to individual portions of the said mining property, should be made appurtenant to the whole of said mining property, as otherwise a sufficient quantity of water is not obtainable to operate said mining property.
- 3. That your petitioner has already expended a very large sum of money in acquiring and working said mining property, and that further capital required is not readily obtainable under the present titles of your petitioner, unless same be consolidated under a more lasting and secure title, and unless said water rights be made appurtenant to the whole of the said mining property.
- 4. That your petitioner was, during the season of 1908, by far the largest operator of mining property in the vicinity of the town of Barkerville, and that the active development of his various mining holdings aforesaid will be one of the chief sources of prosperity, if not the chief, of the said town of Barkerville and the surrounding mining district, and will contribute largely to the prosperity of the whole of the District of Cariboo:

Wherefore, your petitioner prays for an Act to consolidate the mining leases and claims now held by him, which are set out in Part 1 of Schedule "A" hereto, into one holding, with a more lasting and secure title thereto than he has, upon such terms as may seem just, and to declare that the water rights, records or privileges now held or hereafter to be acquired by him shall be conferred and be held and enjoyed as appurtenant to the whole or any part of the mining holdings of the said petitioner, and for powers and authorities which may be necessary or conducive to the above objects.
