PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia :

Whereas there exists a growing inclination on the part of a certain section of this community to secularize the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday, by unnecessarily pursuing the avocations of every-day life in exposing for sale on that day fish, fruits, confectioneries, tobacco, etc., and also on the part of certain persons on that day going out gunning, to the great annoyance of peaceably disposed people residing in adjacent country districts :

And whereas it is expedient, in the interest of public morality and Christian peace and quietude, that proper remedies should be employed having the force of statutory law to remove the evils herein mentioned :

Be it therefore resolved : That, for the better observance of the Lord's Day, we hereby respectfully petition your Honourable Body to introduce and enact such a law as will secure the objects herein referred to, and result in a better observance of the Christian Sabbath in this City and Province, composed almost wholly of professedly Christian people.
