
PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The humble petition of the undersigned sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of incorporating a Company to be known as the Kootenay Power and Light Company, Limited, for the purpose of supplying power, light and heat by compressed air and electricity to the inhabitants, cities, towns, mines, smelters and tramways in the East and West Divisions of Kootenay District, British Columbia.

And with power to construct, maintain and operate tramway and telephone systems in the said East and West Divisions, and to extend the said systems to other districts contiguous thereto.

And to erect and maintain all necessary works, buildings, flumes, dams, raceways, poles, lay pipes and stretch wires for the conveyance and supply of compressed air and electricity as aforesaid, and to expropriate lands for the purposes of the Company.

And also for the purpose of generating power, light and heat as aforesaid, to appropriate and use so much water from Kootenay River and its tributaries, and the Columbia River and its tributaries, as the Company may see fit.

And all other things that are necessary for carrying out the above objects.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable Body may be pleased to pass an Act granting to your petitioners the above powers.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
