## PETITION.

To the Legislature of the Province of British Columbia:

This the petition of the undersigned special ratepayers, under by-law number 18, of the Municipality of Chilliwhack, otherwise known as the Big Prairie Drainage Scheme, humbly sheweth as follows:—

That the said by-law No. 18, has, by the decision of His Honour Judge Bole, dated the 29th day of December, 1893, been declared invalid;

And whereas by an advertisement inserted in the British Columbia Gazette and the Chilliwhack Progress, Mr. E. A. Jenns, barrister-at-law, of New Westminster, has declared his intention of applying to your Honourable Body for legislation on the said by-law;

And whereas at the trial of the case of Chilliwhack versus Bellrose, held at New Westminster on December the 19th, 1893, several discrepancies were shown in the working of the said by-law;

And whereas some of the discrepancies so shewn, consist of the non-assessment of roads situate within the area of the said scheme, and being benefited thereby to a considerable amount;

And also the non-fulfilment of certain promises made at the sitting of the Court of Revision, whereby certain of the undersigned were promised certain ditches and extensions to ditches, which would have provided a better scheme of drainage than at present exists;

And whereas certain of the undersigned claim that under the present scheme they are receiving no benefit, but are assessed;

And whereas certain others of the undersigned claim that they are unequally assessed;

Therefore these, the undersigned, humbly petition your Honourable Body, that prior to legislation being granted on the said by-law, that—

An engineer be appointed to make a re-inspection of the premises supposed to be benefited under the by-law, and to report on any necessary works for the completion of the scheme;

And to make a re-assessment of all properties now included in the scheme;

And to exclude those who, in his opinion, are not receiving any benefit;

And to include those who, in his opinion, are receiving a benefit, but who are at present not assessed.

And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.
