A PROCLAMATION.

H. ALAN MACLEAN, Assistant Deputy Attorney-General. WHEREAS it is provided in and by section 18 of the "Con-Assistant Deputy Attorney-General. Stitution Act," being chapter 65 of the "Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1948," that the Lieutenant-Governor shall from time to time, by Proclamation in His Majesty's name, summon and call together the Legislative Assembly:

And whereas Our said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, did, by his Proclamation issued on the twelfth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, summon Our faithful the Members elected to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Our Province of British Columbia, at Our City of Victoria, to meet Us in Our said Legislature or Parliament of Our said Province, at Our City of Victoria, on Monday, the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, at 3 p.m., for the dispatch of business relating to old-age pensions:

And whereas arising out of the postponement by one week of the visit to Victoria of Their Royal Highnesses the Princess Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh, which will now take place on the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, Our said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, has declared that it is deemed advisable to change the date upon which the Legislative Assembly be summoned and called together:

Now know ye that the provisions of the said Proclamation issued on the twelfth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, are revoked, and by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of the Province of British Columbia, We hereby convoke, and by these presents enjoin you, and each of you, that on Thursday, the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifty one, at 10 a.m., you meet Us in Our said Legislature or Parliament of Our said Province, at Our City of Victoria, for the dispatch of business relating to old-age pensions.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Scal of Our said Province to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, the Honourable CLARENCE WALLACE, Lieutenant-Governor of Our said Province of British Columbia, in Our City of Victoria, in Our said Province, this third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.
