At the opening of last Friday's sitting the Honourable Member for New Westminster rose on a question of privilege, namely, a press release by the Ministry of Education relating to proposed legislation which had not yet been disclosed to the House. The release in question, dated June 21, 1978, states the proposed legislation had in fact been introduced in the House and in that regard the statement was clearly premature.

There have been a number of other occasions when Members have complained that such announcements ought to be made in the House rather than outside, and the Chair has ruled consistently that it is not a matter which may be determined by the Chair (ref. Speaker's Decision, Journals of the House 1973, at pages 106–108; Speaker's Decision, Journals of the House 1976, at pages 107– 108).

These complaints have always been treated as grievances rather than as breaches of privilege and I therefore cannot view the matter before me on any different basis.
