### Honourable Members:

On Thursday last, the Honourable Member for Revelstoke-Slocan rose on a point of privilege relating to the requirement for attendance in the House and referred to the absence of the Minister of Education.

Standing Order 8 provides that: "Every member is bound to attend the service of the House, unless leave of absence has been given him by the House." No distinction is made between Ministers of the Crown and other Honourable Members.

While an unauthorized absence is technically a breach of this Standing Order, it has never been the practice in this House, or in other Parliaments such as Westminster, to strictly apply the rule (May, 16th edition, at page 237). A perusal of the statutory declarations made by members from time to time relating to attendance discloses many instances of absence without leave. It will also be recalled that the *Constitution Act* provides for deduction to be made from allowances to members for absences beyond those permitted by the Act.

The House has on many past occasions temporarily passed over certain items of business and carried on with other business of the House in order to accommodate Honourable Members who, for one reason or another, were absent from the House.

I can find no support for the proposition that the absence of any member or a minister would give rise to a *prima facie* question of privilege.

2. By what amount did this foreign debt increase between April 1, 1977, and June 30, 1977, as a direct result of the devaluation of the Canadian dollar?

3. As a direct result of devaluation, what was the additional cost of servicing this foreign debt during the first quarter of this fiscal year?

4. Taking devaluation into account, what is the average effective interest rate which B.C. Hydro is now paying on its foreign debt?

5. What financial gain, as a result of devaluation, did B.C. Hydro make on debts collected from United States companies, under contracts for electricity, during the first quarter of this fiscal year?

The Hon. Jack Davis replied as follows:

"1. (a) 1,149,963,774 or 28.5 per cent of B.C. Hydro's total outstanding debt, and (b) 1,441,006,274 or 32.9 per cent of B.C. Hydro's total outstanding debt.

"2. B.C. Hydro's liability for foreign debt is translated to Canadian dollars at the rates of exchange prevailing at the date the debt was incurred. Translated at the rates prevailing at April 1, 1977, and June 30, 1977, the liability would have been increased between April 1, 1977, and June 30, 1977, by \$10,028,020.

"3. As a result of devaluation between April 1, 1977, and June 30, 1977, the additional cost of servicing this foreign debt during the first quarter of this fiscal year was \$254,495.

"4. 9 per cent as at June 30, 1977.

"5. B.C. Hydro realized no financial gain, as a result of devaluation, on debts collected from United States companies during the first quarter of this fiscal year for sales of surplus electricity."

And then the House adjourned at 5.54 p.m.
