To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The petition of John A. Finch, Patrick Clark and W. S. Normon, all of the Town of Rossland, in the Province of British Columbia, humbly sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of incorporating the “Rossland Land, Water and Light Company” for the purpose of supplying water for domestic and fire purposes to the inhabitants of the Town of Rossland, and also to supply electric light and power to said inhabitants of said Town; also to supply water, electric lights and electric power to the mines adjacent to the said Town of Rossland.
