PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The petition of Charles G. Major, Hiram P. McCraney, and John J. Ranfield, humbly sheweth:—

That your petitioners believe it to be desirable that another Tramway Line should be constructed, equipped and operated from some point in the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, to some point in the City of New Westminster. Also that other Tramways and Street Railways should be constructed, equipped and operated within the said Cities of Vancouver and New Westminster; using as a motive power for such Tramways or Railways, electricity, steam, or any other motive power. Also that additional Telegraph and Telephone Lines should be constructed, equipped and operated between the said cities.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray that your Honourable Body may be pleased during the the present Session to pass an Act authorizing the constructing, equipping and operating of the said Tramways, Street Railways, Telegraph and Telephone Lines, by your petitioners as a Company, to be known as "The Twin Cities Railway Company."

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
