**11** Mrs. *Wallace* asked the Hon. the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources the following questions:

1. How much office space is rented or leased by B.C. Hydro in Greater Vancouver?

2. How much of that space is presently unoccupied?

3. How much is sub-leased to other companies, and at what net cost to B.C. Hydro?

The Hon. C. S. Rogers replied as follows:

"B.C. Hydro leases 462,281 square feet of office space in Greater Vancouver, of which 58,200 square feet are unoccupied, and 27,899 square feet are subleased to other companies.

"The total net cost of the subleased space to B.C. Hydro cannot be determined at this time. There is a net cost of \$160,000 at one of the three unoccupied sites, and a benefit of \$900 month at one of the others but it is not known how long this space will be subleased. There is no net cost or benefit at the third site."

**12** Mrs. *Wallace* asked the Hon. the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources the following questions:

With reference to the Columbia River power development financing-

1. What is the total expenditure on construction of storage projects to date? What is the estimate of the total amount required to complete these?

2. What are the total expenditures on generation, transformation and transmission facilities to date? What is the estimate of the amount required to complete these?

The Hon. C. S. Rogers replied as follows:

"To date, \$601,671,899 has been spent on the Columbia River Treaty storage projects (the Arrow, Duncan and Mica projects). In order that these facilities be completed, a further expenditure of \$502,534 will be required. Most of this is to be spent on recreational facilities on the reservoirs.

"Expenditures on generation, transformation, and transmission facilities to date total \$670,191,438. These facilities are considered complete."

**41** Mr. *Passarell* asked the Hon. the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources the following questions:

1. How much money has been allocated by B.C. Hydro for 1982/83 on the Liard Hydro project studies?

2. How much money has been budgeted by B.C. Hydro for 1983/84 on the Liard Hydro project studies?

The Hon. C. S. Rogers replied as follows:

"B.C. Hydro allocated \$4,356,226 for studies on the Liard Hydro project in 1982/83. \$2,873,000 has been budgeted for studies on the Liard project in 1983/84.

"This project has been in the wind-up stage for almost a year. Money budgeted for 1983/84 includes close down costs and collection of some environmental data."

**42** Mr. *Passarell* asked the Hon. the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources the following questions:

1. How much money has been allocated by B.C. Hydro during 1982/83 on the Stikine–Iskut Hydro project studies?

2. How much money is budgeted by B.C. Hydro during 1983/84, on the Stikine–Iskut Hydro project studies?

The Hon. C. S. Rogers replied as follows:

<sup>(\*</sup>B.C. Hydro allocated \$23,617,617 to Stikine-Iskut Hydro project studies in 1982/83. \$9,390,000 has been budgeted for these studies in 1983/84.

"As the scheduled date for application for an energy project certificate has been delayed indefinitely, development study work is being brought to a close. Money budgeted for 1983/84 includes completion of field programs, preparation of shelf documentation, site cleanup/reclamation, and preparation of an interim project assessment report."
