Honourable Members:

Earlier today the Honourable Member from Shuswap-Revelstoke asked leave of the House to move a motion under Standing Order 35 for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance relating to three matters; one, to condemn an import tariff on Canadian red cedar shakes and shingles; two, to support the Prime Minister in asking for reconsideration of the decision, and three, urging that any retaliation not impair the Canada-U.S. free trade talks.

While the matter raised is undoubtedly of considerable public importance, in order to qualify, the matter complained of must be raised initially without delay, and in addition, the proposed motion must not raise more than one matter within the same motion. I refer the Honourable Members to Standing Order 35 (10) (b).

For the above reasons, I find the statement does not qualify under the rules of this House relating to a motion for adjournment under Standing Order 35.
