- "Multiculturalism is a theme that pervades all educational program development activities in the Ministry, from the setting of education goals to production or selection of materials. For this reason it is sometimes difficult to relate that part of the budget that could be applied directly to multicultural programs.
- "1. All resources are analyzed and evaluated for balance in ethnic or cultural portrayal. The definition of the educated citizen refers specifically to tolerance/acceptance of cultural differences. Multicultural issues pervade social studies curricula and materials; the primary social studies program is exemplary in this regard. Pacific Rim activities are fundamentally multicultural in nature.
- "The Ministry of Education is involved in a joint project with CIDA entitled *Global Education* which is a multicultural project. Curriculum development in ESL addressed multicultural issues among recent immigrants. ESL is recognized in the fiscal framework in the form of grants to districts offering ESL to immigrant students. A full-time multicultural co-ordinator is to be hired this summer to establish policies in multicultural education and heritage languages.
- "2. If we include the Pacific Rim Initiatives project along with other curriculum areas, the budgets are as follows: 1988/89, \$3.8 million; and 1989/90, \$5.7 million."

Honourable Members:

Earlier today the Honourable Minister of Labour and Consumer Services rose on a matter of privilege relating to remarks attributed to the Member for Esquimalt-Port Renfrew reported in the *Debates* of this House on June 15, 1989.

The Honourable Minister has suggested that the Member for Esquimalt-Port Renfrew has maligned his office, and that of the Attorney General, and that he has done so wilfully and has "discharged his duties to this House in a dishonourable fashion."

Firstly, the Chair must observe that a member, in raising a matter of privilege, may not use language which, if employed in general debate, would be out of order and I find it unparliamentary for one member, in any guise, to suggest that another member has discharged his duties to the House in a dishonourable fashion. I caution all members that in raising points of order or matters of privilege to bear this in mind.

Dealing with the merit of the matter of privilege itself, the Chair notes that the matter complained of occurred in the House on June 15th and the matter was not raised until today and accordingly does not meet the "earliest opportunity" requirement and in this regard I refer all honourable members to the decision of Mr. Speaker Lamoureux contained in the *Journals* of the House of Commons of Canada. June 9, 1969. Mr. Speaker Lamoureux clearly states that it is fundamental to a matter of privilege that it be raised immediately and without delay. The same position is adopted in Sir Erskine May, 17th ed., at page 378 and in our own House in the British Columbia *Journals*, March 15, 1968.

In the absence of an explanation as to why the matter was not raised when it occurred, the Chair has no alternative but to rule that the matter does not qualify under the exacting rules applicable to a matter of privilege.

For the general guidance of members, I might further note that the member raising a matter of privilege must also table, at the time the matter is raised, a copy of the motion the member would intend to move should the Chair find that a *prima facie* case of privilege has been established and in this latter regard, I refer all honourable members to

Parliamentary Practice in British Columbia, second edition, at page 36, which outlines the technical requirements which must be observed in raising a matter of privilege.

For the above reasons, the matter raised by the Honourable Minister does not qualify as a matter of privilege.
