"6. Yes, but only for 30 cars under sublease with Appollo Forest Products.

"7. The railway would assume the original lease arrangement in the event original lessee were to default on monthly rental costs.

"8. Of the 5,375 cars stated to be available, the railway owns outright 1,234. These are: BCIT 3045-3099 (40-foot box) 55, BCIT 40400-41084 (50-foot box) 685, BCOL 3100-3199 (40-foot box) 100, and PGER 40000-40399 (50-foot box) 394."
