PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Honourable Members of Parliament, in Session assembled:

We, the undersigned Committee, appointed by Perseverence Lodge No. 1, Independent Order of Good Templars, to petition your Honourable Body for the passage of a law for the better observance of the Sabbath.
