In the present case, an examination of the Hansard reports would indicate the effect of the proposed closing of this facility is viewed by the Honourable Member one way, and by the Honourable Minister of Human Resources in quite a different way. The Chair is in no position to make a judgement on the merit of either argument, but the existence of such a disagreement impacts directly on the propriety of the subject matter in relation to the motion seeking adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance.

Motions under this Standing Order have been refused when they have been raised some days prior to the disputed event. (*See* Sir Erskine May's Parliamentary Practice, 17th ed., p. 365.)

It is also uncertain, from the matter on hand, whether or not the immediate administrative responsibility for the operation of the Vancouver Transition House rests with the Ministry of Human Resources.

Under all these circumstances, I am unable to find that the matter raised by the Honourable Member qualifies under the strict guidelines relating to motions for adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance.
