
PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The petition of the Burrard Inlet and Fraser Valley Railway Company humbly sheweth:

That your petitioners were by an Act of the Legislature passed in A.D. 1891, Chapter 54, incorporated for the purpose of constructing a railway from a point on Burrard Inlet to some point between the western extremity of the American boundary line at Semiahmoo Bay and the south-western corner of Township 22, in the District of New Westminster, and also a branch line from such point at the boundary to a point in the Municipality of Chilliwack.

That the railway authorized to be constructed was to be begun within two years, and completed within five years after the passing of the said Act.

That your petitioners have been unable to begin the work of construction within the time limited.

Your petitioners therefore pray that your Honourable House will be pleased to pass an Act extending the time for beginning the work of construction for a further period of two years.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
