SIR,-I have the honor to submit the following Returns, Statements of Account, &c., viz.:

Statement of the Revenue for the year ended 31st December, 1874 (partly estimated and closely approximate), certain of the heads of Revenue being classified according to the Electoral Districts of the Province.

Account Current of the Receipts and Payments for the year ended 31st December, 1873.

Statement of the Estimated Revenue for the year 1874, and that received (partly estimated and closely approximate).

Statement of Expenditure for the year 1873, showing that for the last quarter in detail.

Detailed Statement of Expenditure for the nine months ended 30th September, 1874.

The accounts of the following Districts, for the periods named, have not yet been received, viz.:—

Kootenay, for the month of December, 1874;

Cassiar, for the months of November and December.

It will be seen that "Land Sales" yielded (\$23,617 86) a much larger amount than was anticipated for the year 1874 (\$10,000), owing principally to the large quantity of land purchased in New Westminster District.

The item of Rents, Exclusive of Lands, &c., (\$600) has fallen far short of the estimated amount (1,700), in consequence of an unexpected falling off in the receipts for Ferry Rents, &c., in the interior.

The receipts for Free Miners' Certificates and Mining Receipts General, have been largely increased by the yield of the Cassiar District, a very small portion only being Arrears of 1873.

Licences appear to have been over-estimated, but the fact of several Municipalities having been created and collecting and retaining this tax in their various districts being taken into consideration, will probably account for the apparent deficiency.

The amount of Revenue brought to account under the head of Miscellaneous, was during the year 1874 very small, items formerly carried to that account having been during that year carried to other heads to which they more strictly belonged. Under this head, in the Account Current for 1873, are included the following sums, viz.:—

The Tolls collected on Spence's Bridge were received by the Government only during the last three months of 1874, and amounted for that period to \$1,665 30.
