PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The Petition of the Ashcroft and Cariboo Railway Company humbly sheweth:—

That your petitioners were, by an Act passed by your Honourable House on the 26th day of April, 1890, chapter 60, created a body corporate for the purpose of constructing a line of railway from a point on the Canadian Pacific Railway near Ashcroft, thence in a northerly direction to Cariboo;

That by the said Act of incorporation your petitioners were obliged to commence construction within two years from the passing of the said Act, and afterwards in 1891 your Honourable House, among other amendments to the original Act, extended the time for commencing construction to three years from the passing of the original Act.

Your petitioners are desirous of extending the time for the commencement and completion of the proposed line, of changing the point of connection of their proposed line with the Canadian Pacific Railway, of reviving and confirming the grants, rights and privileges conferred on your petitioners, and of amending, revising and consolidating the Acts relating to your petitioners and their powers and privileges into one Act.

Your petitioners therefore pray that your honourable House will be pleased, at the present Session, to pass an Act for the purposes aforesaid.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
