Mr. *Connell* asked the leave of the House to withdraw the following notice of motion standing in his name:—

That the Government instruct Adam Bell, Deputy Minister of Labour, to inform Mr. M. A. Granger, representative of the Pacific Lumber Company, Limited, that it approves the inalienable right of free men to association, deliberation, and collective representation of all matters affecting the interests of workers, and to enjoy British freedom and justice, and that further delay in settlement of the strike by reason of refusal to recognize camp committees will be looked upon as a breach of agreement between the Government and the said Pacific Lumber Company, Limited, or their agents, and deemed sufficient cause to terminate, cancel, and rescind timber leases and logging permits issued to them by the Government.

Mr. Speaker, without putting the question, ruled the notice of motion out of order, and delivered the following decision:—

In reference to the motion of the Hon. the Leader of the Opposition, being No. 2 on the Order Paper of to-day, which reads as follows:—

"Mr. *Connell* to move the following Resolution:—

"That the Government instruct Adam Bell, Deputy Minister of Labour, to inform Mr. M. A. Granger, representative of the Pacific Lumber Company, Limited, that it approves the inalien-

able right of free men to association, deliberation, and collective representation of all matters affecting the interests of workers, and to enjoy British freedom and justice, and that further delay in settlement of the strike by reason of refusal to recognize camp committees will be looked upon as a breach of agreement between the Government and the said Pacific Lumber Company, Limited, or their agents, and deemed sufficient cause to terminate, cancel, and rescind timber leases and logging permits issued to them by the Government.'"

Some honourable members may think this motion should not have been allowed to go on the Order Paper, for being out of order.

May I say that, in my opinion, the Speaker should never refuse a notice of motion being placed on the Order Paper, unless the motion most flagrantly violates the Standing Orders and Parliamentary practice, because by the motion being printed the Speaker is in a position to clearly show where and why the motion may or may not be in order, as required by Standing Order 58. (*May*, 13th, pp. 230-235.)

The above motion of the Hon. the Leader of the Opposition is ruled out of order on the following grounds:—

This is a mandatory motion affecting and dictating Government policy, which, under numerous decisions of this House, is clearly out of order. (B.C. Speakers' Decisions, Vol. I., pp. 61, 77, 80, 81; Vol. II., pp. 35, 36, 37.)

It is out of order also because the adoption of the motion would necessitate the bringing-in of legislation, and as such a Bill would affect the revenue of the Crown it could only be introduced by the Government. (B.C. Speakers' Decisions, Vol. II., pp. 56, 62; *May*, 309.) And, further, the motion is out of order because it would override the provisions of a Statute ("Forest Act") (B.C. Speakers' Decisions, Vol. I., p. 105.)
