To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The humble petition of George I. Wilson, Broker, of the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, and John B. McKilligan and Robert T. Williams, both of the City of Victoria, in the Province aforesaid, sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of incorporating a Company for the purpose of operating a Ferry by steam or other power, for transporting cars holding either passengers or freight, from a point on Burrard Inlet or the Fraser River, or between the above-mentioned places, to connect with the Esquimalt & Nanaimo Railroad at or near the City of Nanaimo, with all powers necessary or conducive thereto.
