The House resumed the adjourned debate on the motion moved by Mrs. Haggen on the 15th instant, as follows:—

Whereas procedure used in many public abattoirs and slaughter-places in British Columbia in killing food animals and fowls is not now consistent with proven humane and modern methods:

And whereas information is available on these methods now in use the world over: Therefore be it Resolved, That in the opinion of this House the Government should consider the advisability of introducing legislation, at the earliest possible date, to ensure that when animals and fowls are slaughtered commercially for food, humane methods are used.

And on the amendment thereto moved by the Hon. W. K. Kiernan, as follows:-

To strike out all words after "House," in the second line of the second paragraph, and to insert the following: "The Government of Canada be requested to give consideration to amending the Criminal Code so as to prohibit slaughter of food animals in packing-houses without stunning prior to bleeding, and to give due consideration to the religious requirements of ethnic groups in Canada."

The debate continued.

The amendment was agreed to.

The motion as amended was agreed to.

Mr. Dowding moved as follows:-

Be it Resolved, That, subject to the provisions of Standing Orders 47 (2), (3), and 48 respectively, the practice of requiring verbal answers from Ministers of the Crown to questions placed on the Order Paper where such questions are "starred" questions shall henceforth be adhered to in this House for the first twenty sitting days of each Session, in accordance with the general practice followed in Westminster and in the Canadian House of Commons, and that the substance of such verbal replies shall be in writing and filed with the Clerk of the House and entered in the Journals of the Session:

And be it further Resolved, That a period of not more than one-half hour be allowed for verbal replies to such "starred" questions at the time for "Questions put by Members," referred to in Standing Order 25, and that such questions be taken in order and if not answered on the day proposed therefor, shall take their place on the Order Paper for the next day following.

A debate arose.

The motion was negatived.

Mr. Gregory asked the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture the following questions:—

1. In view of the commitment of the Minister of Agriculture that the farm programme advertising programme was a part of a permanent programme, when is it anticipated to begin such advertising in 1957?

2. What was the total sum spent on the programme in 1956, what firm handled the

advertising, and was a competition held?

The Hon. W. K. Kiernan replied as follows:—

"1. Not before June 1st, 1957.

"2. (a) \$105,004.55, (b) James Lovick & Company Limited and Canadian Advertising Agency Limited, and (c) a competition was held."

His Honour was pleased, in Her Majesty's name, to give assent to the said Bills.

The said assent was announced by the Clerk of the House in the following words:—

Then Mr. Speaker addressed the Lieutenant-Governor as follows:—

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOUR:

We, Her Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Session assembled, approach Your Honour at the close of our labours with sentiments of unfeigned devotion and loyalty to Her Majesty's person and Government and humbly beg to present for Your Honour's acceptance Bill (No. 75) intituled "An Act for granting certain Sums of Money for the Public Service of the Province of British Columbia."

To this Bill the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, by His Honour's command, did thereupon say:—

"In Her Majesty's name, His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor doth thank Her Majesty's loyal subjects, accept their benevolence, and assent to this Bill."

Then His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was pleased to deliver the following gracious Speech:—

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly:

In closing this, the First Session of the Twenty-fifth Parliament, I desire to express my appreciation for the attention which you have given to the numerous matters submitted for your consideration.

It is commendable to note that you have passed an "Act to provide for Compensation to Blind Workmen for Injuries sustained and Industrial Disease contracted in the Course of their Employment."

The new Department of Recreation and Conservation and the new Department of Industrial Development, Trade, and Commerce will greatly assist the tourist industry and the tremendous industrial expansion taking place in British Columbia.

I am pleased to note than an Act has been passed authorizing the Minister of Finance to sign, on behalf of the Province, a Tax-rental Agreement with the Government of Canada.

The "Provincial Home-owner Grant Act" will give tax relief to the resident home-owner.

The revision and consolidation of municipal legislation in the new "Municipal Act" is most commendable, as well as the new "Act respecting the Operation of Motorvehicles and respecting Highway Traffic."

I thank you for the supplies which you have granted for the Public Service, which will enable the continuation of my Government's programme throughout the fiscal year.

In closing this Session, I trust that the blessing of Divine Providence will accompany you to your respective homes.

The Hon. W. D. Black (Provincial Secretary) then said:—

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor's will and pleasure that the Legislative Assembly be prorogued until it shall please the Lieutenant-Governor to summon the same for dispatch of business, and this Provincial Legislative Assembly is hereby prorogued accordingly.
