
PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The petition of the undersigned residents of the Town of Revelstoke, in the Province of British Columbia, humbly sheweth:—

That a petition has been presented to your Honourable Body by William Cowan, William M. Brown, John Abrahamson, and Thomas Downs, all of Revelstoke aforesaid, praying for an Act to incorporate them into a Company under the name of the “Revelstoke Water-works, Electric Light and Power Company, Limited,” for the purpose of supplying water, electric light and power to the inhabitants of the said town and district around within a radius of ten miles from the said town, with power to take and appropriate so much of the waters of the 1065-Bridge Creek, on the Canadian Pacific Railway, the Right Hand Brewery Creek, the Left Hand Brewery Creek, the Two-Mile North Creek, and the Illecillewaet River, for the purposes of the undertakings of the said Company as may be necessary and proper.

That the Town of Revelstoke at present is very much in need of a water-works system for the convenience of the inhabitants, and also for protection of property in case of fire.

That your petitioners are desirous that an Act be passed by your Honourable Body incorporating the said parties with the powers mentioned.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable Body may be pleased to pass an Act incorporating the said William Cowan, William M. Brown, John Abrahamson, and Thomas Downs for the purposes above mentioned, and with all such powers, rights and privileges as may be necessary and proper for the attainment of the said objects, or any of them.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
