The Committee find, on examination, that the Legislative Library is nominally under the control of the Speaker, but there are no means provided either to increase the utility of the Library or to take charge of the books that are now there.

The Committee recommend that some provision be made for the purchase of books, and that a Librarian be appointed.

That all books be stamped with the name "Legislative Library," in legible characters.

That additional shelves be provided in some of the rooms belonging to the Assembly Chamber until further accommodation is required.

The Committee suggest that no books should be taken out of the building.
