To the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled :

The petition of the undersigned, Walter Archibald Anderson, George Dillon Curtis, William Martin Griffin, Cecil Mack Merritt and Robert Innys Baker Warton, all of the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, humbly sheweth :

That your petitioners desire to be incorporated for the purpose of constructing and operating a railroad from a point at or near Kamloops; thence running in a northerly direction, following the valleys of the North Thompson River, the Canoe River and McLellan's Creek, to a point at or near Tête Jaune Cache, in the said Province.

Wherefore, your petitioners humbly pray that you may be pleased to pass an Act for the purposes above mentioned, to be an Act intituled "An Act to Incorporate the Kamloops and Yellow Head Pass Railway," and, as in duty bound, your petitioners will ever pray.
