DEAR SIR,—In accordance with instructions received from James Baker, Provincial Secretary, I secured the services of a canoe and proceeded down Camp and Hope Sloughs, also up to Maria and Herling Sloughs as far as St. Elmo, and interviewed the farmers as to their wants, and, as you will see by the enclosed accounts, I have distributed 40 sacks oats, 120 sacks barley, 140 sacks potatoes. Potatoes being short, I exchanged 3 sacks barley for 3 of potatoes. There was also furnished, in addition to seeds, to T. Coverdale, P. McGrath, M. Gilbert, and J. Munroe, flour and bacon, which you will find charged up in their accounts. P. McGrath was furnished, at the request of H. T. Read, of the steamer "Courser," with what provisions he wanted.

I enclose you our account of services rendered, amounting to \$494.

SIR,—I have been instructed by the Government to write to you in reference to your bill for services of steamer "Popcum," which is considered *excessive*.

It appears you told Col. Baker that your boat would carry eight tons, and with that understanding he engaged your services, at \$25 per day, thinking you could do the whole of the work in two trips, or in a week at the most.

As a matter of fact, you could not get up the river with three tons, but had to stop at an island and land one ton to enable you to proceed.

Now, the whole amount you carried up for distribution did not exceed eight (8) tons.

Your services were engaged on the 22nd day of June, but you did not commence working till the 23rd. Now, Mr. Woods finished his work on the 4th of July, and was home in New Westminster on the morning of the 5th, and he states you were doing quite a stroke of work for yourselves during the time. You were not working on Sunday, June 24th, also July 1st, so it is very difficult for us to see where you get in eighteen days.

The Government therefore requests that you will reconsider your account, and send it in very much cut down, to correspond better with the amount of work done.

Your early reply will greatly oblige.

DEAR SIR,—We are in receipt of yours of the 14th asking for detail of eighteen days' work of steamer. It is as follows:—The first work done was on Sunday, May 27th, and the four following days taking stock off the islands between here and the Orchards; and also up Maria Slough. The work done during this time was for the following parties, viz.: D. Greyell, Rossdale P. O.; Jas. McDonald, Maria Slough; M. J. Murphy, Wm. English, and E. H. Bell. You understand this work was done without instructions from the Government or any one else. There was no means of communicating with the proper authorities; our Wm. Knight simply did what he considered right.

On Saturday, June 2nd, the writer of this arrived home, and next day met Mr. Thos. Cunningham, of New Westminster, who informed him that he had the authority of the "Finance Minister" to say that what we had done the Government would pay for, and to keep right on as long as any stock was in danger. Acting under these instructions the writer in person worked for eight days with the little steamer taking off horses, cattle, &c. Mr. Cunningham in person was with the boat for five or six days during this time, and knows the nature of the work done. We wish you would write him on the matter if you want any further information. After the water began to go down Mr. W. Knight spent one day up the river taking people with their stock back to their homes. He also spent four days distributing seeds. This does not include two short trips made up to Maria Slough with grain, nor one down to Greyell Landing also with grain that had been sent over the road by waggon from Chilliwack. For the above three trips we made no charge, as we were doing work for ourselves at the time, and did not have to get up steam on purpose. From the foregoing you will see that the work of boat was as follows:—

W. Knight, with steamer, six days; the writer eight days, and four days distributing seed—in all eighteen days. In conclusion we wish to say that the Government can do just as they think proper about paying this bill. That not a single animal was lost up in these parts goes to show that the work was well done.

We consider the letter received from Mr. Townsend an insult, and whether the Government settle our account or not we shall deal with him later on.

DEAR SIRS,—I am in receipt of your letter of the 24th ultimo explaining your account in detail, and shewing that the steamer "Popcum" was employed for eighteen days in removing cattle and distributing seed.

The charge of \$25 per day would be too much for the whole length of that time. I have therefore allowed that amount for the number of days the steamer was employed in distributing the seed as agreed with me, and \$20 per day for the remainder of the time, and I now enclose a voucher for the balance of your account, and upon your signing the receipt and sending it to the Treasury a cheque for the amount will be sent to you.

As I am shewing in my report upon the Fraser River Relief the number of cattle, horses, pigs, &c., removed, and the list is now complete with the exception of yours, I shall be obliged if you will send me at your earliest convenience the number of the stock you removed, and, if possible, the names of the owners.
