REPORT OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE.

MR. SPEAKER:

Your Committee beg to present the following returns:—

1. Revenue from 1st January to 31st December, 1879.

2. Balances, various.

3. Outstanding on lands, 31st December, 1880.

4. School tax collected in 1880 from whites and Chinese.

5. Amounts due by Municipalities to Provincial Government, 31st December, 1880.

6. Road tolls collected in Cassiar, 1879 and 1880.

7. Balances, various.

8. Assets of the Province 31st December, 1880.

Return No. 4 shows the amount of school tax collected from the Chinese throughout the Province. A return by Districts was applied for at the Treasury, but not obtained. Such a return would be of some value, as it would assist members with a knowledge of the Districts they represent in forming an intelligent opinion as to whether a large number of Chinese are, as has been asserted, evading the payment of this tax.

In the Revenue returns, the custom exists of combining New Westminster City with New Westminster District. Your Committee are of opinion that they should be separated so that the revenue collected from each of these Electoral Districts can be

known.

As the financial year does not now terminate until the 30th June, it is quite impossible for your Committee (sitting in March) to form any opinion as to the accuracy

of the estimates of revenue and expenditure passed last session.

For the future your Committee consider that any supplementary sums required to make good the expenditure of the current financial year should be brought down early in the session, and before the estimates for the ensuing year are considered by the Legislature.

It is also desirable that an estimate by the Finance Minister of the balance with which the current financial year will close should be brought down with the supplementary sums above referred to, so that members, before voting the ensuing year's Estimates,

may have some idea of the financial situation.

Your Committee have examined into the two claims of Mr. E. Allen against the Government, consisting of one sum of \$94 for services rendered re "Scotty," and another of \$91.12 arising from his accounts with the Treasury when acting as Collector for the Lillooet District. They find that the sum of \$91 was paid Mr. Allen, on account of the former, in February last, so that that claim may be considered as substantially settled. With regard to the latter, they find that it mainly arose from a clerical error in Mr. Allen's statement,—an under-estimate of the amount of School Tax collected by him in 1879, as shown by the counterfoils sent by him to the Treasury. The claim of Mr.

Allen in this respect is therefore groundless.

It appears, however, that in the settlement made by the Treasury with Mr. Allen, in August last, he is charged with the sum of \$73.77, under the heading of miscellaneous receipts. This, it is claimed by the Department, was done at Mr. Allen's special request. Your Committee are of opinion that, had Mr. Allen understood the accounts, he would not have done this, as the Treasury had already charged him with all that could be fairly charged against him from the Assessment Rolls and counterfoils of School Tax and Mining Receipts. The corrections made by the Treasury, from time to time, in Collectors' statements, show that the rule of the Department, very properly, is to be governed by the figures of its own audit, and not by those of the Collectors. To this rule the intrusion into Mr. Allen's account of the \$73.77, above referred to, is certainly an exception.

It appears that Mr. Allen has received \$7.37 as 10 per cent. commission on the \$73.77, and has also had credit for delinquent tax \$4, Edward Nelson, collected by him.

After a careful consideration of the whole matter, your Committee are of opinion that the difference between the \$73.77 and \$11.37, amounting to \$62.40, is owing by the Treasury to Mr. Allen.
