To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled :

The humble petition of the Cariboo Gold Mining Company sheweth :—

That your petitioners are desirous of presenting a bill for the purpose of obtaining an Act of the Legislature of the Province of British Columbia consolidating the several placer mining leases, claims and other property now held by them into one lease, with a more lasting and secure title than they now have, upon such terms as may seem just, and declaring that the water privileges and all other rights, easements, powers, privileges and appurtenances now held by them, or that may be appurtenant to any of the hereditaments now held or hereafter to be acquired by them, may be held and enjoyed as appurtenant to the whole or any part of the hereditaments and premises now held or hereafter acquired by them, as they may desire.
