REPORT OF SELECT COMMITTEE.

ROYAL HOSPITAL.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislature.

The Committee appointed to visit the Royal Hospital beg leave to report that there are 24 beds, also 18 patients at the present in Hospital, and, with one exception, all speak well of the institution and the treatment they receive.

All speak very highly of the physician in charge.

We find it in the interest of the patients to have the Hospital visited each year by a Committee of this House, and would strongly recommend this to be carried out.

We found the whole establishment strictly clean, and provisions good and wholesome.

Your Committee also visited the Convalescent Home, and found it well adapted for that purpose, and would strongly urge the Government to take into consideration the necessity of completing the same for the reception of ineurables.
