
PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament Assembled:

The petition of the Lightning Creek Gold Gravels and Drainage Company, Limited Liability, humbly sheweth:—

1. That your petitioners are a Company duly incorporated under the provisions of the "Companies' Act, 1890," and amending Acts (British Columbia), with the principal place of business at the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia.
