## PETITION

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The humble petition of the undersigned Aldermen of the City of Vancouver sheweth :----

1. That on the 27th day of February, 1893, at a meeting duly held of the Council of the City of Vancouver, a motion was introduced to authorize a petition to your Honourable House praying for legislation to validate By-law No. 166 of the said City, and the said motion was voted upon and rejected by the Council, not being within the laws of procedure.

2. 3. That your petitioners are prepared and willing to prove the truth of the matters set forth in this petition, if desired by your Honourable House.

Your petitioners humbly pray that your Honourable House will be pleased to refuse the prayer of the said petition of the Corporation of the City of Vancouver.
