The humble petition of George de Wolf and William Crickmay sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of incorporating a company for the purpose of constructing, maintaining works, and using the waters of Seymour Creek, Burrard Inlet, British Columbia, or the waters of any other creek or creeks that to them may seem fit to utilize, for the purpose of generating electricity to be used as a motive power, or for such other purposes as to the company may seem fit, in the City of Vancouver, British Columbia, or elsewhere, as to the company may seem fit:

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable House may be pleased to pass an Act incorporating the "British Columbia Electric Company," conferring upon the said company the powers above set forth or referred to.
