To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The humble petition of the undersigned, Harry Abbott, gentleman; William Braid, importer; R. P. McLennan, hardware merchant; W. H. Armstrong, contractor; George E. Trorey, jeweller; William Ferriman Salsbury, local treasurer of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company; Charles A. Godson, merchant; George S. Harrison, bank manager; Archibald York, capitalist; and V. C. James, all of the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, sheweth:—
