That your petitioners are desirous of establishing water works at the Town of Trail, West Kootenay District, British Columbia, and supplying water to the inhabitants of the said Town of Trail, and district, for mining, domestic, agricultural, manufacturing, fire and other purposes.

And also to obtain and hold water rights, concessions, and every right and privilege connected therewith.

And also to lay pipes and to dig ditches, canals, flumes and aqueducts for the conveying and supplying of water, and for the purposes of the Company's business.

The water to be obtained from Gorge Gulch and Blue Grouse Gulch and their tributaries, and from the adjacent Grass Springs and Look Out Lake, near the said Town of Trail.

And your petitioners are desirous of being incorporated as a Company for the purpose of carrying out the objects hereinbefore mentioned.

And all other powers necessary for the above objects.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable Body may be pleased to pass an Act granting to your petitioners the above powers.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
