During this period the Council exercised both executive and legislative functions; and in the absence of supplementary supporting material, it is frequently impossible to determine, in a given instance, whether the actions of Council should be viewed as the enacting of legislation or the tendering of advice to the governor on executive affairs. The situation is further complicated by the fact that in the same period Governor James Douglas served not only as the representative of the crown but also as agent of the Hudson's Bay Company, which held proprietary rights to the colony and was obligated by its charter to provide certain public services as well as to pay the costs of the civil and military establishments. Douglas himself apparently forwarded only three acts to the Colonial Office for formal approval; the establishment of the Supreme Court of Civil Justice, 2 December 1853; the prohibition of gifts or sale of liquor to Indians. 2 August 1854; and the regulations for the Victoria Colonial Church, 2 August 1856. (Vancouver Island Registry of Acts, CO 383/91, p. 1; see also Grey to Douglas, Confidential, 5 CO 410/1, pp. 68 ff.). Yet in response to a request from the Assembly for legislation previously passed by the Council, Douglas forwarded copies of ten ordinances that, he said, were "enacted by the Council [and] at present in force in this Colony." (Douglas to Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly, 27 May 1857, Vancouver Island, House of Assembly, Correspondence Inward, 1856–1860, p. 15, PABC.). Unfortunately copies of these ordinances have not survived, and the dates given for them do not always coincide with the actions of Council as indicated in the minutes.
