To the Honourable Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled :

The humble petition of Robert Alexander Anderson, Harry Victor Burner, John A. Flett, William Henry Goodwin, all of the City of Vancouver, in the said Province, and Michael King, of the City of Victoria, in the said Province, sheweth :----

1. That it is in the interest of the public that a line or lines of telegraph and cable from some point in the City of Nanaimo to some point in the City of Vancouver, and thence to the City of New Westminster, passing through the said City of New Westminster and across the Fraser River to some point at or near Brownsville, in the said Province of British Columbia, should be laid, constructed, equipped and operated, with power to acquire lands and to erect stations at any intervening points between the above mentioned places, and to make arrangements with and to connect with other telegraph companies.

2. That your petitioners are desirous of being incorporated as a company for the purpose of laying, constructing, equipping, and operating such lines of telegraph and cable and having granted to them the usual powers necessary, incidental or conducive to such purposes.

Your petitioners, therefore, most humbly pray leave may be granted to bring into your Honourable Assembly a Bill for their incorporation, as aforesaid, and for the granting to them the rights, powers and privileges hereinbefore mentioned.
