Prayers by Mr. Speaker.

The Hon. J. A. Nielsen made a statement relating to the death of the Hon. William Norman Whittaker, a former Speaker of the Legislative Assembly.

Mr. Speaker delivered his reserved decision as follows:

Honourable Members:

On Thursday last the member for Mackenzie sought to raise a matter of privilege with respect to answers given by the Minister of Environment to oral questions. In his remarks the member made reference to a letter from the Manager of Land Administration, Ministry of Lands, Parks and Housing, a copy of which was tabled. The member did not table a proposed motion to be moved in the case of my finding a *prima facie* case of breach of privilege, nor did he allege that the Minister had deliberately mislead the House.

I have now obtained and examined the Hansard transcript, and note that in the member's earlier question and his statement of the matter it is clear that there is a dispute as to facts between two honourable members.

The letter tabled by the member involved the issuance of a licence of occupation by the Ministry of Lands, Parks and Housing, while his question, and those of other members, involved the issuance of a licence by the Ministry of Environment.

As stated in Citation 113 of Beauchesne's 4th edition:

"a dispute arising between two members as to allegations of facts does not fulfil the conditions of parliamentary privilege."

For the above reasons, I find that a *prima facie* case of breach of privilege has not been made out.
