REPORT OF SELECT COMMITTEE ON PRAYER.

Moved by Mr. Ferguson, seconded by Mr. McGillivray,-

That, in the opinion of this House, it is advisable that Mr. Speaker do read a prayer before proceeding to the business of the day, and that a Select Committee be appointed to arrange a suitable prayer for the occasion; said Committee to consist of Messrs. The Honourable Mr. Beaven moved, in amendment, seconded by Mr. Galbraith,-

To strike out all the words after "That" and insert the following:—"a Select Committee be appointed to ascertain from the Clergy of the City, whether they can attend the opening of each sitting of the Legislature and open the proceedings with prayer; the Committee to arrange a suitable prayer for the occasion and report to this House. Committee to consist of Messrs. Galbraith, McGillivray, Walkem, Pimbury, and Ferguson.

MR. SPEAKER,

The Select Committee appointed to ascertain from the Clergy of the City whether they could attend the opening of each sitting of the Legislature and open the proceedings with prayer, and to arrange a suitable prayer,

Beg to report that they have had an interview with the Clergy of the city, and all of them, without a single exception, approved of the resolution adopted by the House.

Your Committee would submit the following form of prayer, it being a copy of the one used at present in the House of Commons, Ottawa, so modified as to make it suitable to this Province.

Your Committee further recommend that Mr. Speaker should communicate and arrange with the Clergy of each denomination for their weekly attendance to read prayers before the House proceed to business.
