To the Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly

Gentlemen

I herewith forward for your information an Abstract of the Accounts of the Hudsons Bay Company with Her Majesty's Government, for monies received and disbursed on account of Vancouvers Island Colony, as shewn by their accounts at this place since the Establishment of the Colony in the Year 1849.

None of those accounts have been finally audited, and those relating to the Year 1859 have not yet been submitted to Her Majesty's Government and are consequently open to correction.

The documents referred to will be found described in the accompanying schedule numbered from 1 to 5.

No. 6 is a Statement of the revenue and Expenditure of the Colony for the Seven months ending with December 1859, received at and paid from the Treasury since its Establishment in May last.
