PETITION.

*To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of
British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:*

The humble petition of the North Star and Arrow Lake Railway Company, a body corporate, duly incorporated by chapter 58 of the Statutes of British Columbia, 1898, sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of having passed an Act of your Honourable House, extending the time within which the security mentioned in section 40 of the said chapter 58 shall be given by the said Company; and extending for one year the time within which the sum of ten thousand dollars, in the said section mentioned, shall be expended, and further to amend the said Act by adding as a third section to the Schedule thereof the words “a railway from a point at or near Fort Steele, on the line of railway mentioned in the first section of this Schedule, by the most feasible route to a point at or near Golden,” and confirming and ratifying to the petitioners the powers of the Company, and all the rights and privileges conferred by their said Act.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable House will be pleased to enact accordingly, and your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
