
PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia:

The humble petition of Charles Wilson, John Harold Senkler and Edgar Bloomfield, sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of incorporating a Company to supply water for domestic, fire, manufacturing, mining, milling, smelting, reduction and other purposes to the inhabitants of Greenwood City, Anaconda, Midway and Boundary Falls, in the Yale District of British Columbia, and to all extensions of the said towns, and to any mines, mills, manufactories, smelters, reduction, refining or other works in the said towns, or in the said districts or the vicinity thereof, and to the mines, mills, manufactories, smelters, reduction, refining, or other works now or hereafter to be operated in the said towns or in the district or vicinity thereof.

That your petitioners are advised that a company formed for the above purposes would be of great use to the inhabitants of the said towns and to the mines, mills and manufactories now in operation in and near the said towns, and which it is anticipated will be operated and brought into existence in the said district.

That water from the said creeks will be better used and conserved if operated by one company than if the same were permitted to be used by several companies or individuals, who would not have the same interest in properly conserving the whole of the said waters of the said creeks.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Honourable House will be pleased, at your present Session, to pass an Act granting to your petitioners the right to take and use the waters of Boundary Creek, Boundary Falls, Twin Creek, Lind Creek, Providence Creek, Copper Creek and Eholt Creek, in the said Yale District of British Columbia, with power to supply the said waters for the purposes stated in the foregoing petition, and with all other necessary powers, rights and privileges for carrying out the above objects.

And your petitioners will ever pray.
