FIRST REPORT OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE.

Mr. Speaker:

The Committee have examined into the large outstanding balance of account due by the Assessor and Collector of the Lillooet District, and find as follows:

- 1. That the Assessor and Collector, Mr. Allen, was appointed by an Order in Council of August, 1876, at a commission of five per cent. on the Assessment Roll of 1876, and 10 per cent. on subsequent Rolls.
- 2. That on the 17th June, 1878, the Provincial Secretary (Mr. Elliott), by letter to Mr Allen, agreed to allow him 25 per cent. commission from date of appointment until 30th June, 1878, and 20 per cent. thereafter for assessing, collecting and payment of expenses connected therewith.
- 3. That no Order in Council was passed authorizing such commissions to be paid to Mr. Allen.
- 4. That the School Act limits the commission to 10 per cent. and such travelling expenses as the Government may consider reasonable.

As the good faith of the Government with its servants should be kept, and the commissions of 25 per cent. and 20 per cent. cannot legally be paid, the Committee respectfully recommend the following settlement with the Assessor and Collector of Lillooet: A commission of 10 per cent on total sum collected; a deduction of sundry small accounts amounting to \$26.50, and an allowance for expenses sufficient to balance

The Committee have examined the statements, memoranda and correspondence relating to the accounts of the Gold Commissioner at Cassiar.

Part of the expenditure in Cassiar was made without authority, but taking into consideration the remoteness of the District and unforeseen circumstances arising, your Committee are of opinion that much of it could not be avoided.

The Committee are of opinion that there is no necessity for the Gold Commissioner retaining on hand \$6,000 or \$7,000 of public moneys. They recommend that the revenue collected should be sent down from time to time, and that no large balance should be retained.

In case of extraordinary emergency, merchants would readily make advances to the Government Agent, and take orders on the Treasury at Victoria in payment.

The Committee find it impossible to ascertain the exact amount owing the Province for lands sold.

The Committee beg to hand in as follows:-

- 1. Return of Assessment Rolls for 1878, showing amounts of rolls in each district, sums collected, and balances outstanding 31st December, 1878.
 - 2. Return of indemnity and mileage paid members during 1878.
 - 3. Return showing dates salaries were paid after 30th June, 1878.
 - 4. Return (approximate only) of amounts due Treasury on lands disposed of.

SECOND REPORT OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE.

MR. SPEAKER:

Your Committee have examined into the statement made by the Honourable Mr. Beaven, Finance Minister, when submitting the Public Accounts to the 31st December, 1878, viz.: "That a proper audit of Provincial Accounts to 30th June, 1878, does not appear to have been made," and beg to report as follows:—

That an error of \$1,000 was made in posting up the Sub-Accountant's account of Cariboo, in October, 1876, which remained undiscovered until the autumn of 1878.

That an error of \$550 was made in posting up the Sub-Accountant's account of Kootenay, in August, 1876, which also remained undiscovered until the autumn of 1878.

That the balance, Bank of British Columbia Graving Dock Account, \$35,647 35, on 31st December, 1876, was omitted to be brought down in the Treasury Ledger, on the 1st January, 1877, and that, on the 14th July, 1877, the sum of \$35,647 35 was posted in error to the Bank of British Columbia Current Account, instead of to the Bank of British Columbia Graving Dock Account, and that these mistakes were not detected by the Auditor.

That there was no pass book of the Bank of British Columbia Graving Dock Account, and that the pass book of the Bank of British Columbia Current Account was not periodically checked by the Auditor.

That counterfoils and accounts from many Collectors and Sub-Accountants throughout the Province, during the year 1877 and for the first half of 1878, have never been audited; and that many of the packages containing counterfoil receipts sent to the Treasury during that period were not even opened.

The Committee are of opinion that, in the interest of the public service, it is desirable that the responsible position of Finance Minister should at all times be held by a gentleman possessed of a knowledge of accounts.
