A PROCLAMATION.

E. PEPLER, *Deputy Attorney-General.* } WHEREAS We are desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People of Our Province of British Columbia, and to have their advice in Our Legislature:

NOW KNOW YE, that for divers causes and considerations, and taking into consideration the ease and convenience of Our loving subjects, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of the Province of British Columbia, to hereby convoke, and by these presents enjoin you, and each of you, that on Wednesday, the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, at 3 p.m., you meet Us in Our said Legislature or Parliament of Our said Province, at Our City of Victoria, FOR THE DISPATCH OF BUSINESS relating to the matter of relief and rehabilitation in the flooded areas of British Columbia.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said Province to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, the Honourable CHARLES ARTHUR BANKS, Lieutenant-Governor of Our said Province of British Columbia, in Our City of Victoria, in Our said Province, this sixteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of Our Reign.
