To the Honourable the Speaker and to the Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled:

The humble petition of the undersigned, Albert Howard MacNeill, barrister and solicitor; James Henry Kennedy, civil engineer; and Earl Bradford Howes, civil engineer, all of the City of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, sheweth:—

That your petitioners are desirous of obtaining an Act to incorporate a company, with power to build, construct, maintain, and operate a railway of standard gauge, to be operated by steam, electricity, or other motive power, for the purpose of carrying passengers and freight from a point at or near Penticton, in the District of Yale, to a point at or near the International Boundary in the vicinity of Osoyoos Lake, with power to construct and acquire, own, and maintain wharves, steam and other vessels and boats, and to operate the same on any navigable water, and all powers given by the "Model Railway Bill," and with said other powers and privileges usual or incidental to all or any of the aforesaid purposes.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that they may be incorporated into a company for the aforesaid purposes, with such rights, powers, and privileges as your Honourable Assembly may be pleased to grant.
