To the Honourable the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia, in Parliament assembled.

The humble petition of the Right Reverend Paul Durien, O. M. I., Roman Catholic Bishop of New Westminster; the Rev. J. M. Fayard, O. M. I.; the Rev. J. M. Jayol, O. M. I.; the Rev. A. Doutenwill, O.
