PETITION.

To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia in Parliament assembled:

The petition of the Vancouver, Northern and Yukon Railway Company humbly sheweth:—

- 1. That your petitioner is a company duly incorporated by Act of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, passed in the year 1899 and intituled the "Vancouver, Northern and Yukon Railway Company Act, 1899."
- 2. That your petitioner is desirous of having the said Act so amended as to extend the time within which your petitioner may complete its undertaking and deposit with the Minister of Finance and Agriculture the security therein mentioned, and to enable the Company to extend its line of railway from some point at or near the City of Vancouver, or some other convenient point on the shore of Burrard Inlet, to some point on the north or south side of the Fraser River at or near the City of New Westminster, and to change the name of the Company by inserting the word "Westminster" after the word "Vancouver," and to confer such other powers as may be necessary to fully and completely execute, carry on, and operate the said undertaking.

Therefore your petitioner most humbly prays that leave will be granted to bring into your honourable Assembly a Bill as aforesaid, to amend your petitioner's said Act of incorporation.
